Natural Sciences Component

9-12 credits

One biological and one physical or chemical science course. Required Courses:

Microbiology

Chemical or Physical Science

Anatomy and Physiology

Humanities/Fine Arts Component

9-12 credits

Courses from art, dance, drama, English, foreign languages, linguistics, music, philosophy, religion, speech and certain courses in communication, writing and women's studies (see catalog). Required Course:

Introduction to Philosophy, Logic, or Critical Thinking

Social Science Component

9-12 credits

Courses from economics, geography, history, government, psychology, sociology, and urban studies. Required Courses:

General Psychology

Introduction to Sociology

Statistics

3-4 credits

***Art/Aesthetic Component (A)**

3-4 credits

One course devoted primarily to the development of skills in human expression for the purpose of engaging the aesthetic sense, or to the development of students' critical appreciation of aesthetics.

***Writing Intensive Courses (W) – 2 courses required**

Courses transferred from other institutions cannot satisfy this requirement.

NUR 432 Nursing Research

***Non-Western Course (NW) – 1 course required**

Course that deals either in a direct or in a comparative way with contemporary non-western and/or Third World concerns.

NUR 430 Elective

SOC 100 Introduction to Sociology

***International/Global Awareness Course (IG) – 1 course required**

Course that deals in a direct or comparative way with political, social, cultural or economic issues impacting the global arena.
