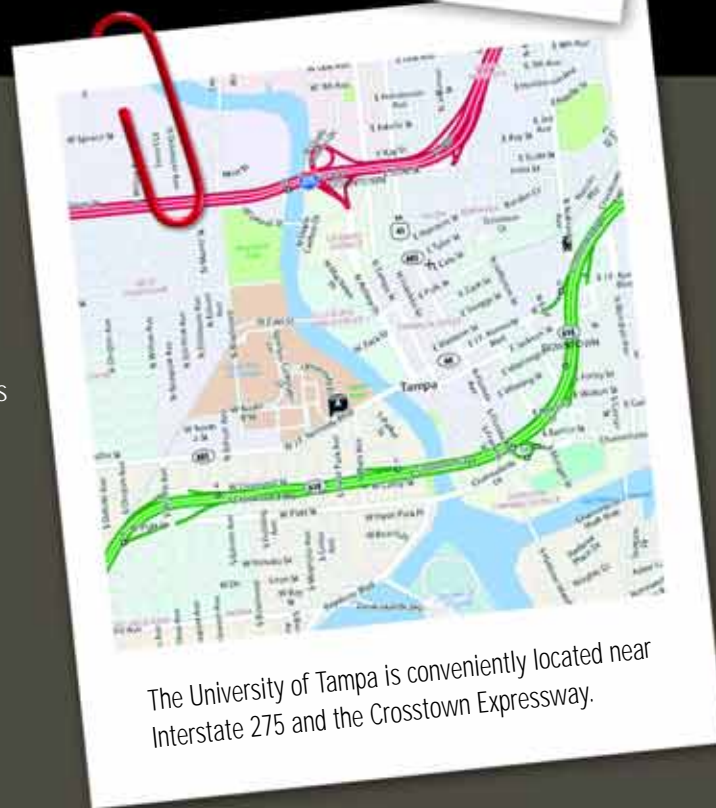


Getting Started

- Apply online at www.ut.edu/evening (PDF version also available).
- Submit application fee.
- Provide high school transcripts and/or GED scores and high school transcripts up to the time of departure.
- SAT or ACT scores not required for applicants who have graduated from high school more than two years ago.
- Official transcripts from each previously attended post-secondary institution.

A personal advising appointment is recommended. Appointments are available after 5 p.m. Contact the School of Continuing Studies at scs@ut.edu or 813-253-6249, Plant Hall, Room 237.

Financing Your UT Education

Evening College students enjoy a discounted tuition rate. Students registered in six to eight credit hours per semester may apply for Federal student loans and the Pell Grant. To apply, complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

All Evening College students are assigned a financial aid counselor. UT's Financial Aid Office is located in Plant Hall, Room 427, (813) 253-6219, or online at www.ut.edu/financialaid.

Outside Sources of Financial Assistance:

- **Employee Reimbursement** – Contact the HR department of your company to determine the availability of a tuition refund plan. The University requires only half the cost of tuition at the beginning of the term. Visa and MasterCard are accepted for payment.
- **Veterans Benefits** – Contact the local Veteran's Benefit Office. UT's Veterans Benefit Representative is located in the Registrar's Office, Plant Hall Room 113, (813) 253-6251.

University Services

Good Advice

Advising help is 24/7. Students are assigned a faculty advisor in their major during their first semester. School of Continuing Studies staff facilitate the admissions and registration processes. UT's online services, SpartanWeb, is available 365 days a year and can help you create a degree guide for your academic program.

Flexibility

Begin in August, January, May or July. Classes are offered year round in two 14-week semesters and three summer sessions. Students may enter the Evening College at the beginning of any term. Most students take six to eight courses per year. Evening College classes begin as early as 4 p.m., but most classes begin at 6 p.m. (Monday-Thursday).

Solid Support

The Academic Center for Excellence (ACE) offers free tutoring on weekends and at other convenient times. The Saunders Writing Center helps students become more effective writers. Students are assigned a UT e-mail account which they can access from home or office, and enjoy free wireless access throughout the public areas on campus plus students can connect to research resources around the world through UT's Macdonald-Kelce Library's ESEARCH online database.
