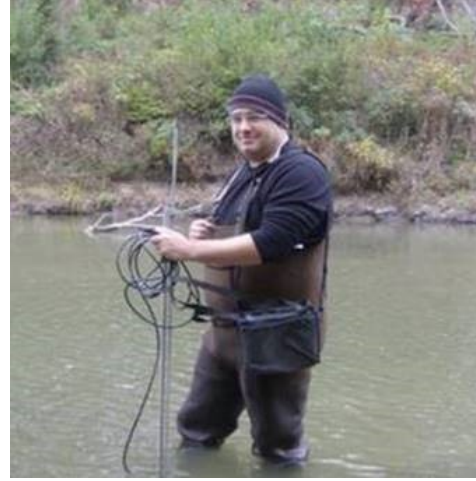

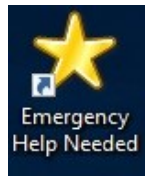

Did you know?



There is an **emergency help** icon that is normally added to the desktop of the Podium/Instructor workstations within the classroom. Within computer lab classrooms, the icon is only present on the podium workstation (not the student workstations).

The positioning of the icon on the desktop can vary, depending on what other icons are also located there, but if it has been added to the workstation, it should be viewable on the desktop. If you are teaching in a classroom that does not have this icon on the Podium computer's desktop, please let Victoria Majors know which classroom and she will make sure to have it added. **The button should only be used in a true emergency situation, when you do not want anyone else to know that Campus Safety has been contacted.**

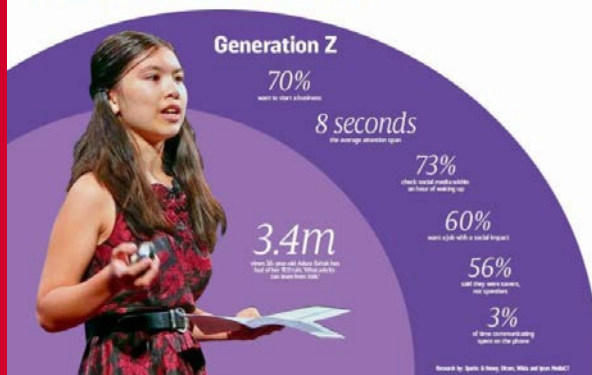
Please note that it cannot be added to portable devices as it does not have GPS capabilities. Her email is VMajors@ut.edu
