Undergraduates majoring in criminology and criminal justice have the unique option to enroll in UT's **M.S. in Criminology and Criminal Justice** program. In an accelerated 4+1 format, students may take two graduate-level classes during their senior year and then complete the master's program in just one additional year of study.

This program prepares students for both practitioner and management careers in criminal justice and public safety, and also provides an excellent foundation for law school or doctoral studies. Students gain the theoretical groundwork along with the research and statistical skills needed to design and evaluate effective public safety policy and practice. Courses also provide in-depth study of the structure of the criminal justice system.
