

International Faculty Development Awards

International Partner Institution Collaboration Award (IPIC)

The University of Tampa | Office of International Programs

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Applications are due **November 15, 2019**. The funds are available for use beginning May 1, 2020 and must be used by August 20, 2021.

PURPOSE

As part of the Sophomore Semester Signature Abroad Program, The University of Tampa has developed affiliation agreements with the University College of Dublin, Ireland and the Universidad Pablo de Olavide in Seville, Spain. Invited students study abroad during the fall semester of their sophomore year at these institutions, providing UT students with a variety of courses that will seamlessly transfer to UT. In order to further these relationships, the Office of International Programs is funding faculty development awards to facilitate collaborations between members of the UT faculty and faculty members at these partner institutions.

The intent of these International Partner Institution Collaboration (IPIC) awards is to identify, develop, and promote collaborative scholarly activities with faculty members at our partner institutions.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must be full-time members of the faculty at UT. Visiting members of the faculty and other members of the faculty in their terminal year of employment are not eligible to apply.

IPIC AWARD FUNDS

The Office of International Programs based on recommendations from the International makes IPIC awards Programs Committee. The funds are available for use beginning May 1, 2020 and must be used by August 20, 2021. The award covers travel, accommodation and per diem and all travel arrangements are made through the Office of International Programs. As a condition of the award, recipients are expected to file a report per institutional guidelines, give a presentation on campus within one year of completing funded activities, submit a short article (500 words) suitable for publication in *World View* magazine, and award recipients are expected to recognize the award in any publications or other scholarly output resulting from this award. Awardees should contact the Office of International Programs with any questions regarding this award, not to exceed \$3,500 in reimbursable expenses.

OTHER CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

- It is expected that the majority of awards will be made to facilitate travel to one of the partner institutions where other scholarly activity or development of planned activities will take place.
- IPO will assist in bringing international collaborators to The University of Tampa as part of scholarship or related activities conducted in the US.
- Applicants may reapply for the award annually.

The Office of International Programs will make all successful applications available to future applicants, in hardcopy format.

EVALUATION OF PROPOSALS

Award proposals will be evaluated by members of the International Programs Committee, who will provide a prioritized list of proposals recommended for funding to the Associate Dean of International Programs. Review of applications will be based on the potential of the proposed project to result in productive collaboration in scholarly works including publications, ongoing research (e.g., data collection), and similar activities, as well as the potential impact of the project on the University community. Priority for funding may be given to proposals that include current UT students in some aspect of the scholarship. Proposals must be accompanied by a letter of support from a collaborator at the partner institution provided on institutional letterhead (PDF copies are acceptable).

NOTIFICATIONS

The Office of International Programs regarding the recommendation and funding decisions will notify applicants.

REPORTING AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SUPPORT

The Office of International Programs will work with award recipients to schedule an appropriate time for an on-campus presentation relevant to the funding received. It is the recipient's responsibility to file required institutional reports per University policy. The funds should be acknowledged in any scholarly output (publication, exhibit, etc.) as having been from The University of Tampa, International Partner Institution Collaboration Award.

SUBMISSIONS

Include your name and the award program to which you are applying in any document name that you are uploading. (Example: Jane Doe_International Faculty Development Seminar Award.)
